

How to Suede your Shoes

New or Old Shoes:

1. Scrub with hard bristle brush with detergent until clean
2. Scrub sole with Denatured Alcohol. Dilute alcohol:
50% alcohol & 50% water
3. Apply all purpose Loctite Adhesive (or some
Other adhesive that glues rubber) to both the
Underside of the suede and top of sole. **Do not use Pliobond brand which doesn't work nearly as well as Loctite. He also says to get the adhesive that takes 24 hrs to dry and not the instant which is much harder to apply correctly.**
4. Put suede on rubber sole, and position quickly.
5. Clear all air bubbles, and secure and fold over
Edge on toe where applicable.
6. Put in front of fan for a minimum 2 hrs. For a fast dry.

The micro suede for furniture runs about \$10/yard.

One dancer purchased an inexpensive pair of suede slacks at a second hand store and cut them up to cover her shoe bottoms -- a great idea and really heavy duty suede.
